Minutes of the 5th meeting of Academic Council held on 28.12.2012 at 11.00 a.m. in the Senate Hall of DTU.

The Fifth meeting of the Academic Council of DTU was held on 28.12.2012 at 11.00 a.m. in the Senate Hall of DTU.

The Minutes of the meeting are as follows:

Agenda 5.1 : Chairman's opening remarks

The Vice Chancellor extended a warm welcome to the learned members of the Council and informed that:

- (i) The University during the last one year has made a commendable progress both in respect of its academic as well as research excellence.

- (ii) The rating of the University in the independent surveys has placed DTU in Top 10 among the best Engineering Institutions in India including the IITs.
- (iii) The campus placement has been phenomenal, as many as 176 companies visited last year and made 761 job offers. This year (2012-13) up to 24th December, 2012, as many as 95 reputed companies have come for campus placement and have made 657 job offers. The highest salary has gone up to Rs. 60 lakhs p.a., 06 students receiving 60 lakhs p.a. package is a record in itself and reflects the high reputation of DTU in the eyes of the leading industries and MNCs.
- (iv) The UGC Expert Committee for approval of DTU under section 12(B) of UGC Act has also visited the University in October 2012 and it is reliably learnt that the approval of UGC has been accorded to the University for 12(B). This will ensure that the University receives funding for variety of academic and research programs from the UGC from the central funding.
- (v) It would be important on our part to submit proposals to UGC for funding in January 2013. Accordingly, Pro-VC has been asked to prepare the application for UGC funding in consultation with the HoDs and Deans.
- (vi) On the initiative taken by the Chairman, Board of Management, Shri R.P. Agrawal, the IIIT Allahabad has made Nobel Laureate Prof. Roger D. Kornberg available for Nobel Lecture at DTU on December 19th, 2012. The visit of Nobel Laureate to DTU has marked a new era of our connect to the Nobel Laureates.
- (vii) On the research and development fronts, it is highly commendable that the DTU Faculty has received sponsored R&D funding of approximately Rs. 11.5 crores from various sponsoring agencies such as DST, DBT, MNRE, CSIR, BARC, Department of Atomic Energy, ICMR etc. This is highly significant as it marks the 10 fold increase in sponsored R&D at DTU. Further, it has been observed that out of Rs. 11.5 crores sponsored R&D approximately Rs. 10.5 crores have been received by the new DTU faculty. It is hoped that this will inspire other members of the faculty to take initiatives to submit sponsored R&D projects.
- (viii) As far the innovations are concerned, it is a matter of great privilege and honour for the University fraternity that the First Solar Car of India designed and developed by the DTU students under able leadership of Shri Dheeraj Mishra was flagged off from Rashtrapati Bhawan by Hon'ble President of India on September 4th, 2012.
- (ix) Further, the Unmanned Aircraft System, DTU UAS Aarush X1 designed and developed by the DTU student team with the sponsorship of Lockheed Martin was unveiled by Dr. V.K. Saraswat, Director General, DRDO and Scientific Advisor to Raksha Mantri in presence of the Chairman, BoM, Shri R.P. Agrawal and the Chairman (RAC), DRDO, Dr. D.N. Reddy on November 2nd, 2012.
- (x) The Department of Electrical Engineering has organised the IEEE India International Conference on Power Electronics (IICPE 2012)" from 6th – 8th, December 2012 at DTU. There have been a host of other professional programmes and activities to significantly rejuvenate the professional connect of students and faculty at DTU to the world of profession of engineering and technology.
- (xi) On the foreign University front, the Chancellor of Cleveland State University visited DTU along with Dr. Monte Ahuja and Mr. Raj Soin. Delegation from University of Houston, Universities in France, Germany, Netherland, Australia,

Russia, Tokyo Institute of Technology, Japan, Zimbabwe and Mozambique also visited DTU during the year.

The Vice Chancellor placed on record his high appreciation of the excellent work done by the faculty and staff of DTU in taking the University to such great heights and hoped that the tempo of academic and professional excellence shall continue and new strides shall be made in areas of high national and international relevance to cause the expansion of academic and research activities at DTU in the coming years.

Agenda 5.4 : Matter for information

i. Organizing of First Convocation of the University on 11th January, 2013

The Academic Council was informed that the First Convocation of the University will be held on **Friday, 11th Jan, 2013 at 11.00 a.m.** in Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Auditorium of the University for conferment of the

degrees on the candidates of M.Tech & MBA who have passed out in the year 2011 and 2012 respectively. The medals and prizes will also be given to overall toppers and Branch toppers of Post Graduate Programs.

The Students of B.E. & M.E. Programs of Delhi University, who passed out in the year 2007-2011 and have not yet received the degrees, shall also be distributed degrees in the Convocation along with the Medals & prizes of those years.

Hon'ble Lt. Governor/Chancellor of DTU has consented to be the Chief Guest on the occasion. It was informed by the Chairman that Dr. A.K. Walia, Hon'ble Minister for Higher and Technical Education shall be Guest of Honour and Prof. Goverdhan Mehta, National Research Professor at Hyderabad University, former Director IISc, Bangalore has kindly accepted our invitation to deliver the 1st Convocation address.

ii. Visit of UGC Team for recognition of the University under Section 12(B)

An Expert Committee of UGC visited the University during 26th and 27th October, 2012 to consider the proposal of the Delhi Technological University for recognition under Section 12(B) of the UGC Act, 1956. It has been learnt that, the UGC has approved the University under section of 12(B), however, formal letter of approval from the UGC is awaited. The proposal for Grant-in-Aid from the commission for infrastructure, Establishment of Research Centre and new courses in emerging areas, shall be submitted soon.

iii. Visit of Nobel Laureate Prof. Roger D. Kornberg on 19.12.2012

The Council was informed that Nobel Laureate Prof. Roger D. Kornberg, Winner of Nobel Prize in Chemistry - 2006, visited the University on 19.12.2012 on the invitation of the University. Prof. Kornberg delivered a lecture on 'the molecular basis of eukaryotic transcription' in the Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Auditorium, DTU. Shri R. P. Agrawal, IAS(Retd.), Chairman, Board of Management, DTU presided over the function. Shri Lalma Sawma, IAS, Principal Secretary (TTE) and Prof. M. D. Tiwari, Director, IIIT, Allahabad were the Guests of Honour on the occasion. The Nobel Lecture was attended by a large number of faculty and students of the University and also from Schools and Colleges in North Delhi.

iv. Approval of courses from AICTE

The Academic Council was informed that AICTE had given approval for all the B.E and M.E Programs offered by the erstwhile DCE till 2009-10. After re-constitution of DCE into DTU in the month of July, 2009, the name of the Programs were changed as B.Tech and M.Tech Program from the year 2009-10, however, the candidates admitted upto the year 2009-10 in the D.U courses were allowed to continue with the Programs namely B.E. & M.E respectively.

In the year 2009-10, no approval was taken from the AICTE for starting 4 new B.Tech Programs and 7 M.Tech Programs by the University as no such approval was mandatory from the AICTE for the Universities to start any new Program. The University however, has submitted the proposal for approval of all the 15 B.Tech, 17 M.Tech and 1 MBA Program in the year 2011-12 for 2 years from 2010 to 2012. Further, a fresh proposal was submitted in the year 2012-13 for approval of AICTE, which is under their consideration. The University has provided all relevant information desired by the AICTE to their Zonal office at Chandigarh. It is hoped that the approval will be received from AICTE in near future.

Decision : The Academic Council took the above matters on record.

Agenda 5.5 Matter for ratification:

i. Approval of Degree Format

The members of the Council were informed that the Degree formats for M.Tech. and MBA programs have been approved and given for printing in the Press, so, that students who have passed out M.Tech. and MBA programs from the University in year 2011 and 2012 could be awarded their degree in the forthcoming Convocation Scheduled to be held in January, 2013. The controller of the Examination apprised the members about the security features in the Degree format to safe guard duplicacy.

ii. Admission of Shri Manhar Gopal in the 3rd Semester of B.Tech. Program

The Academic Council was informed that, on receiving DO dated. 15.10.2012, the matter of admission of Shri Manhar Gopal in the 3rd Semester of B.Tech. program was placed before the Council in its Emergent meeting held on 22.10.2012. The Academic Council after detailed deliberation had observed that it would neither be in the interest of the University nor in the interest of the candidate to admit him in the University.

The observation of the Academic Council was communicated to the Hon'ble Chancellor on 26.10.2012. In response to the same, a direction was again received vide UO No. 23(1)/12-RN/373/16688 dated 15.11.2012, to admit Mr. Manhar Gopal S/o Dr. Rakesh Verma on extreme compassionate grounds in the 3rd Semester of B.Tech. Accordingly, Shri Manhar Gopal was admitted in 3rd Semester of B.Tech. (Mechanical Engineering) of the Academic Session 2012-13. Further, a committee comprising of the following Officers is constituted to decide the equivalence/compatibility of the courses studied by Mr. Manhar Gopal in the 1st to 3rd semesters in R.V. College of Engineering, Bengaluru and to suggest the residual courses, if any, to be cleared by him for his further progression in the B.Tech. Program at DTU.

1. Dean(Academics)
2. Prof. S.K. Garg, Professor, Mechanical Engineering & HOD DSM.

3. Controller of Examination

The members of the Academic Council were of the view that the council has taken note of the action taken by the University as the admission has been made under the directions of the Hon'ble Chancellor.

(iii) Proforma of Forms used by the University for the Students

The Academic Council was informed that the University has been using the forms for use of the students, the contents/format of which are needed to be approved by the Academic Council. The Chairman asked the Controller of Examination to go through the format of the provisional Certificates. The Controller of Examination apprised that the format is not devised by the Examination Branch; it is used by the Academic Section from a long time. After deliberation the Academic Council authorised the Dean (Academic) and The Vice Chancellor for approving the proforma of the forms. It was decided that the provisional certificates shall be issued to all the students after declaration of their result subject to the condition that NOCs have been submitted by the student concerned to the Academic Branch from all the concerned departments. The Dean (Academic) and Controller of the Examination will sign the provisional certificates.

Decision : The Academic Council ratified the actions.

Agenda 5.6 (a) : Confirmation of admission of students in all the programs of the University i.e. B.Tech. B.Tech (Evening), M.Tech, MBA and Ph.D including students under NRIs/PIOs/FN category during the academic session 2012-13.

The Academic Council was informed that this year also, the University conducted on line counselling for admission to all the 15 B. Tech. programs in 8 rounds, from 2nd July to 20th August, 2012, followed by one spot counselling which was held on 31.8.2012 strictly on the basis of merit/rank secured by the candidates in AIEEE-2012. 1591 candidates are presently on roll in B. Tech programs including seats reserved for NRIs/PIOs/FNs against 1607 available seats.

The admission to B.Tech.(Evening) program was made on the basis of merit/rank secured by the candidates in the Entrance Examination conducted by the University on 24.6.2012. The counselling for B. Tech.(Evening) programs was held during 16th to 19th July, 2012.

The admissions to 17 M.Tech. Program (Full time and Part Time) were made by the University Selection Boards constituted for each department/discipline as per procedure approved by the Academic Council. The Selection Boards of all the departments met on 4th and 5th June, 2012 on pre-specified dates to select the candidates for M.Tech. Programs. The list of selected candidate was department wise uploaded on website of the University on 7th June, 2012. All the admissions to M.Tech. programs were completed during the period from 11th June to 20th June, 2012.

The admissions to MBA program were made by the University during the period from 12th March to 30th April, 2012 as per pre-notified schedule and admission procedure approved by the Council.

The admissions to Ph.D. program were made during 08.06.2012 to 11.06.2012 as per the admission procedure approved by the Academic Council. In all 78 candidates were

admitted in the program in the year 2012-13. The breakup of the Full Time and Part Time candidates admitted under the program are as follows:

Full Time candidates (With scholarship)	:	13
Full Time candidates (Without scholarship)	:	10
Part Time candidates	:	55

Further, it was informed that the University has provided 27% OBC reservation in admissions to all the UG/PG Programs as per the decision of the Govt. of Delhi. The admissions were closed on 31st August, 2012 in all the programs offered by the University.

Decision : The Academic Council approved the admissions of the students in all the B. Tech., B. Tech (Evening), M. Tech., MBA, and Ph.D Programs of the University, Academic session 2012-13.

Agenda 5.6 (b) : Appointment of Teaching cum Research Fellows.

The Academic council was informed that the Board in its 2nd meeting held on 21.11.2009 had created 20 Teaching cum Research Fellowship and 5 Post Doctoral Fellowship in order to keep pace with research beyond teaching at UG /PG level. The interviews for selection of candidates for the above were along with the candidates for PhD programs during the period from 9.06.12 to 10.06.12. All the 5 (2 TRF & 3 PDF) recommended candidates who were issued offer have joined the University.

Decision : The Academic Council approved the Appointment of Teaching cum Research Fellows.

Agenda 5.7 (a) : Approval for conferment of degree to M.Tech and MBA pass outs for the year 2011 and 2012

The Academic council was informed that as per the provision prescribed in the section 25 (xii) the council has the power to declare or review the result of the various examinations or to appoint committees or officers to do so, and to make recommendations regarding the conferment or grant degrees, honours, diplomas licences, titles and marks of honour. Accordingly, a list of degree recipients of 2009-2010 and 2011-12 batch students of M.Tech and MBA Programs, who have successfully completed the requirement for the award of degree in the years 2011 and 2012 is annexed as **Annexure I** for award of the degree in the DTU convocation 2013.

The Controller of Examination apprised the council that Vice Chancellor has already given approval for inclusion of the name of the M.Tech and MBA students for award of the degree whose results will be declared upto 31.12.2012 , whether, the names of the candidates whose results will be declared after 31st December, 2012, should also be included in the list for conferment of Degrees. The Council, after deliberation took the conscious decision that the M.Tech and MBA students whose results will declared upto 08th Jan, 2013 by the University, their names should also be included in the list for conferment of the Degree during forthcoming convocation. However, all such students whose results shall be declared between 29th Dec, 2012 to 8th January, 2013, shall not be considered for the award of medals and Certificates.

Decision : The Academic Council approved conferment of degree to M.Tech and MBA pass out students for the year 2011 and 2012 (as in the list) with the condition as stated in para 2 above.

Agenda 5.7 (b) : Declaration of the result of Ms. Shweta (2K10/CTA/23) M.Tech (Computer Technology and Application (Part- time) and award of M.Tech Degree.

The Academic Council was informed that Ms Shweta was admitted in M.Tech CTA (P/T) programme in 2010 and her admission was confirmed by the academic council of DTU as part time candidate in the 2nd meeting of the academic council. Accordingly her academic schedule was planned for 6 semester in the line with the part-time scheme and she completed two semesters as part-time candidate and her result for first and second semester were notified where the SPA was computed on 9 or 11 credits basis.

Her admission from part time M.Tech program to full time was converted vide letter No.104/DTU/Acad/Admission/6127-31 dt.07/07/11 and she was permitted to complete her remaining subjects and second semester in parallel with the subjects she was supposed to complete fifth and sixth semester as a part-time student. On the basis of the semester wise courses taken by Ms. Shweta the final result of Ms. Shweta was declared as a part time candidate who has completed her six-semester programme in two years by concurrently completing Vth semester parallel to third semester and VIth semester parallel to fourth semester

Decision : The Academic Council approved for award of the Degree to Ms. Shweta.

Agenda 5.8 : Approval for Institution of the Chancellor Gold Medal and the Vice Chancellor Gold Medal

As per provision under Sub Section 1(xiii) of Section 25 of the DTU Act, 2009, the Academic Council has the powers to recommend Stipends, scholarships, Medals, Prizes and to make other awards with the regulation and such other conditions as may be attached to the rewards.

Accordingly, the University proposes to institute Chancellor Gold Medals and Vice Chancellor Gold Medals. The Chancellor Medals will be awarded to over all topper for B.Tech. and B.Tech.(Evening) Programs combined and M.Tech. and MBA programs combined. The Vice Chancellor Medals shall be awarded to overall topper of each branch of B.Tech. B.Tech.(Evening), M.Tech. and MBA programs.

The Chancellor Gold Medal and Vice Chancellor Gold Medal which will be awarded during first Convocation of the University will be made of 100 grams of silver with Gold plating. A sketch of the Gold medal with inscriptions written on both sides.

A committee of the following officers constituted to prepare frame work of the regulation for the award of Gold Medals of DTU students has made their recommendation vide minutes dated 13.12.12.

The Head Computer Engineering Department informed that M/s Samsung India Ltd. has conveyed their willingness to institute a Gold Medal of 30 gms pure Gold which will be given to the toppers of M.Tech, Software Engineering and M. Tech. Software Technology. The Gold medal in M.Tech Software Engineering is proposed to be given from the year 2013 and in M.Tech Software Technology from the year 2014. The Chairman appreciated the initiative taken by M/S Samsung India Ltd. and expressed his desire that HoD of each Academic Department should endeavour for getting one endowment Gold Medal instituted in the University.

The Council authorised vice Chancellor, Dean (Academic) and HOD for the Deptt. (Computer Engineering) to finalize the details of the Gold medal.

Decision : The Academic Council approved the recommendation of the Committee as in para 5.

Agenda 5.9 : Fee Concession, financial assistance and concession in hostel fee for the students hailing from weaker sections of the society/family with poor financial background

The Academic Council was informed that as per the decision of the Academic Council taken in its Fourth meeting, approved by the Board of Management in its Sixth meeting, a committee was constituted to prepare guidelines for fee concession, financial assistance and concession in hostel fee for the students in DTU hailing from weaker sections of the society or family with poor financial background. The composition of the committee was as follows:-

The committee perused the recommendation of the committee and decided to approve the same with the stipulation that two additional books shall be provided over and above the prescribed norms to the poor and needy students of the university

Decision: The Academic Council approved the recommendation of the committee annexed as per Annexure II with the stipulation that two additional books shall be provided over and above the prescribed norms to the poor and needy students.

Agenda 5.10 : Admission Policy for the academic year 2013-14

The University has to announce its admission policy for admission to all the B.Tech., B.Tech.(Evening), M.Tech./MBA and Ph.D programs for the ensuing academic session 2013-14. The policies proposed to be followed program-wise are as follows –

(i) **B. Tech program**

The Council was informed that the admissions to B.Tech. programs during the academic session 2012-13 were made on the basis of merit/rank secured in AIEEE conducted by CBSE, Delhi. This year it has been notified by the CBSE that in pursuance of Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India, Notification, the Joint Entrance Examination (Main) - 2013 will be conducted by the JEE Apex Board, CBSE for admission to Undergraduate Engineering Programmes in NITs, IITs and other Centrally Funded Technical Institutions etc. Now, AIEEE will be known as JEE (Main) and IIT-JEE as JEE (Advanced).

The admission to Undergraduate Engineering Programs at NITs, IITs, other centrally funded Technical Institutions, Institutions funded by several participating State Governments, and several other Institutions shall include the performance in the Joint Entrance Examination, JEE (Main). For admission to NITs, Centrally Funded Technical Institutions like IITs etc. and other participating Institutions, the merit/rank list shall be prepared based on

40% weightage to School Boards marks in Class 12th or equivalent examination and 60% weightage to JEE(Main).

The AICTE vide its letter dated 5.11.2012 addressed to the Principal Secretary (Higher and Technical Education) Govt. of Delhi, a copy of which has been forwarded to the University by the Department of Training and Technical Education vide their letter dated 5.12.2012, has conveyed further that atleast 40% weightage will be accorded to 12th Board examination and remaining weightage will be accorded to the main examination conducted centrally by the JAB/CBSE.. However, the states may decide to have higher weightage at 12th Board performance, if they so desire.

In view of the above, the University proposes to opt the merit of JEE(Main) examination conducted centrally by the CBSE for year 2013-14 with the stipulation that 40% weightage will be accorded to 12th Board Examination and remaining 60% weightage will be accorded to JEE(Mains) 2013 conducted by CBSE, New Delhi. The candidates who are declared eligible by the CBSE for counselling and who will apply for admission to the Delhi Technological University will only be considered for admission on the basis of merit prepared by giving weightage as above.

Further, the Region-wise seats, application fee, eligibility conditions, reservation and admission procedure and withdrawal/cancellation of admission and refund rules will be as follows:

The total seats marked for the full time B. Tech courses shall be allocated region-wise as follows

- (i) **Delhi Region** – For students passing from the recognized Schools/Colleges/Institutions located within the National Capital Territory of Delhi – 85%
- (ii) **Outside Delhi Region** – For students passing from the recognized schools/colleges/institutions located outside the National Capital Territory of Delhi – 15%

Note : The criterion for deciding the region of the candidate who have passed/appeared in the qualifying examination through Patrachar Vidyalaya. Delhi/National Institute of Open School, Delhi is whether centre of examination was/is located in the NCT of Delhi or outside NCT of Delhi.

a. Except for nominees of Govt. of India, the admission is open to Indian Nationals only.

b. Application Fee:

It is proposed to fix application fee as Rs 1000/- for applying through on-line for admission to B. Tech program as per the year 2013-14.

c. So far as eligibility criteria and procedure for admission, it will remain the same as is followed in the year 2012-13.

Reservation

SC/ST/OBC - With regard to reservation policy in respect of SC/ST/OBC it will be provided as follows :

SC	:	15%
ST	:	7.5% or as per policy of Govt. of Delhi
OBC	:	27%

The candidate claiming reservation in admission for Delhi region under SC/ST/OBC category shall be required to produce caste certificate issued by Govt. of NCT of Delhi.

Single Girl Child - Reservation of one seat, over and above the normal intake, in each B.Tech program of the University for the Girl Candidates from the family having only single girl child. The admission to such girl candidates shall be made on the basis of merit / rank prepared by giving weightage of 60% to JEE(Mains) and 40% weightage to Board subject to fulfilment of other eligibility conditions as laid down for admission to B.Tech Program of DTU.

Kashmiri Migrants Seats (KM) - One seat over and above their normal intake earmarked is reserved for Kashmiri Migrants candidate who have passed 10+2 from schools located in NCT of Delhi for admission to B.Tech. courses.

Sub categories under General/SC/ST/OBC Category

Defence Category - 5% reservation being provided to the defence category candidates that includes 5 Priorities out of 7 recommended by Ministry of Defence in their letter of dated 17.11.2000. The admissions to the seats earmarked for Defence quota be made from among the candidates from the following five categories in the order of the priority given below:

PRIORITY I - Widows/wards of Defence Personnel/Para Military Personnel killed in action.

PRIORITY II - Wards of serving personnel and ex-servicemen/Para Military Personnel disabled in action.

PRIORITY III - Widows/wards of Defence Personnel/Para Military Personnel who died in peace time with death attributable to Military Service.

PRIORITY IV - Wards of Defence Personnel/Para Military Personnel disabled in peace time with disability attributable to Military Service.

PRIORITY V – Wards of ex-servicemen personnel and serving personnel/para military/police personnel who are in receipt of Gallantry Awards.

Persons with Disability (PWD) - 3% of the total seats will be reserved for Persons With Disability. The 3% reservation shall be allocated as follows: 1 percent for persons with low vision or blindness, 1 percent for hearing impaired, 1 percent for those with locomotor disabilities and/or cerebral palsy.

Relaxation in Minimum Eligibility SC/ST/OBC and PWD : As proposed in Agenda No.5.11 (a)

Withdrawal/cancellation of admission and Refund Rules As proposed in Agenda No.5.11 (b).

(ii) B. Tech (Evening) program

The university has been offering B. Tech (Evening) program in four disciplines of Electrical Engg., Electronics & Communication Engg., Mechanical Engg. with intake 41 each and Civil Engg with intake 45 and 46 inclusive of seats increased due to implementation of 27% OBC reservation. The classes are held 6 days in a week in the evening from 6.00 p.m. to 9.00 p.m.

The following admission policy may be laid for the program:

- a. Admission to the evening programs shall be made on the basis of merit/rank secured in the merit of the respective branch in the Entrance Examination conducted by the Delhi Technological University.
- b. The eligibility conditions for admission and Selection Procedure shall remain the same as it was followed for the academic session 2012-13.
- c. With regard to reservation in respect of SC/ST/OBC it will be provided as SC : 15%, ST : 7.5% or as per policy of Govt. of Delhi and OBC : 27%. **The candidate claiming reservation in admission under SC/ST/OBC category shall be required to produce caste certificate issued by Govt. of NCT of Delhi.**
- d. One seat in each programme is reserved for employees of Delhi Technological University/Netaji Subhash Institute of Technology/it is/Polytechnics under the direct control of Department of Technical Education, Government of NCT of Delhi. Such candidates shall also appear in the Entrance Examination and compete amongst themselves for a seat in each branch. Candidates applying for staff seat should route their application through the Registrar, DTU/ Directorate of Technical education, Government of NCT of Delhi in case of Polytechnics/IITs.
- e. 3% of the total seats in each programme are reserved for persons with disabilities candidates. These 3% reservation may be allocated as follows: 1 % for persons with low vision or blindness, 1 % for hearing impaired, 1 % for those with locomotor disabilities and/or cerebral palsy. Candidates seeking admission in PWD category shall be eligible for concession in minimum marks in PCM as proposed in Agenda 5.11(a). The candidates shall be required to appear before a medical board to be constituted by DTU.
- f. Application Fee:
Rs 1000/- was fixed as application fee for the Entrance Examination to be conducted by DTU for admission to B. Tech Part-time (Evening) program.

Withdrawal/cancellation of admission and Refund Rules: As proposed in Agenda No.5.11 (b).

(iii) M. Tech and MBA program

The admission policy in respect of eligibility conditions for admission, selection procedure and application fee for M. Tech and MBA program as followed in the academic session 2012-13 shall also be followed in the session 2013-14.

With regard to reservation in respect of SC/ST/OBC it will be provided as SC : 15%, ST : 7.5% or as per policy of Govt. of Delhi and OBC : 27%. **The candidate claiming**

reservation in admission under SC/ST/OBC category shall be required to produce caste certificate issued by Govt. of NCT of Delhi.

The seat matrix showing number of seats category wise and sponsored seats shall remain the same as it was followed for the academic session 2012-13.

Relaxation in Minimum Eligibility for SC/ST/OBC and PWD : As proposed in Agenda No.5.11(a)

Withdrawal/cancellation of admission and Refund Rules As proposed in Agenda No.5.11(b).

(iv) Admission to NRIs, Foreign Nationals and Persons of Indian Origin under B. Tech. and M. Tech programs for the session 2013-14

It is proposed that this year also maximum of 5% of total sanctioned intake in each B. Tech and M. Tech program shall be earmarked for admission to the above categories of candidates.

1 NRIs.

An individual is Non-Resident when he is "not a resident" or who is "not ordinary resident". A person is treated as "Non-Resident" when any of the following conditions is satisfied:

If he/she has not been resident in India in nine out of ten preceding years or

If he/she has not been in India for a period of 730 days or more during preceding seven years.

Only a person who is a NRI himself/herself may seek admission and no other candidate without NRI status would be eligible. **Admission under this category shall be made on the basis of the merit as per score in SAT-II Level II(scores with Physics and Mathematics) for B. Tech and GRE for M. Tech. courses.** Any seats remaining unfilled from the NRI quota will be filled from the applicants for admission under foreign nationals/Persons of Indian Origin as per the merit of the candidates subject to their eligibility for admission to the University.

2 Persons of Indian Origin

"Persons of Indian Origin" (PIO) in this context means a person having foreign citizenship (except Pakistan and Bangladesh) without "NRI" status, but who holds a Foreign Passport at the time of sending application, consideration for admission and during the period of his study and he/she or anyone/ both of his/her parents or anyone/ both of his /her grandparents is (or was) / are (or were) citizen (s) of India by virtue of the provisions of the Constitution of India or Section 2 (b) of Citizenship Act, 1955 (Act No. 57 of 1955).

3 Foreign nationals

"Foreign National" (FN) in this context means an individual having citizenship of a foreign country (citizens of all countries other than India) and not having the status of "NRI" and/or "Persons of Indian Origin" (PIO).

The admission to Foreign Nationals will be covered under the quota of Ministry of External Affairs (Education Division), Govt. of India as under:-

One seat each in Civil Engg., Mechanical Engg., Production Engg., Computer Engg., Electronics & Communication Engg. and Electrical Engg.

The admission to the above categories shall be on the basis of the following criteria:

Eligibility Criteria

a. B. Tech. Program

The candidates besides securing 60% or more marks in the aggregate of Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics should have also qualified in SAT II Level II examination with Physics and Mathematics to be eligible for admission under the above category.

So far as eligibility criteria and procedure for admission is concerned, it will remain same as is followed for admission in academic session 2012-13.

b. M. Tech. Program

Qualification: Entry qualifications shall be the same as prescribed for the Indian students pursuing M. Tech program.

Selection criteria: 80% on the basis of GATE/GRE and 20% on the basis of interview.

So far as eligibility criteria and procedure for admission is concerned, it will remain same as is followed for admission in academic session 2012-13.

The new academic session shall commence from 1st August 2013.

Admissions to all the programs of the University shall be closed by Friday, 30th August, 2013.

Decision: The academic Council approved the admission policy as above for admission to all the B.Tech. , B.Tech (Evening) , M.Tech. MBA and Ph.D programs for the academic year 2013-14.

Agenda 5.11 (a) : Relaxation of marks in eligibility conditions in respect of candidates belonging to SC/ST/OBC and Persons with Disability in B.Tech., M.Tech., MBA and B.Tech.(Evening) programs

The Academic council was informed that the University is providing Relaxation of marks in eligibility conditions in respect of candidates belonging to SC/ST/OBC and Persons with Disability (PWD) in B.Tech., M.Tech., MBA and B.Tech.(Evening) programs but it is found to be different in different programs. Further, in case of OBC, it has been found that, there is no clarity in this regard in the Prospectus for the year 2012-13 in respect of B.Tech. and M.Tech. programs. However, 5% relaxation in marks has been provided to OBC candidate in MBA program. Considering this fact, 5% relaxation in marks were provided to the OBC candidate's for M.Tech Program in year 2012-13.

In the case of Anmol Bhandari Vs. DTU & Others, Hon'ble High Court of Delhi has observed that giving only 5% concession in marks to PWD candidates as opposed to 10% relaxation provided to SC/ST candidates is discriminatory and PWD candidates are also entitled to same treatment and directed that the DTU to provide 10% relaxation to the candidate.

In view of the above, it has become necessary to remove the shortcomings and frame the policy with regard to relaxation of marks in eligibility conditions uniformly for all the programs in the following manner:

Decision : the Academic Council approved the proposal.

Agenda 5.11 (b) : Cancellation/withdrawal of admission and Refund Rules for the year 2013-14

The Academic Council was informed that the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi has given a decision in LPA No.830/2011 filed by Nitul Dutt Vs. NSIT & Others that the Respondents should streamline the admission procedure henceforth and that from next academic session, the 4 months' time for cancelling/withdrawing of admission should be reduced to one week to avoid chances of dual admissions by the students and to provide opportunity to other aspiring candidates who are really serious to take admission in any program in the University. This matter was placed in the 4th meeting of Academic Council held on 9.11.2011 but deferred to be places in the next meeting of the Academic Council.

The Academic Council Was further apprised that during the academic session 2012-13, candidates were allowed to withdraw/ get Cancelled their admission on or before 31.8.2012 were eligible to get full refund of fee after depositing Rs.1000/- in the form of Demand Draft as Processing Fee. Those candidates withdrawing admission after 31.8.2012 were eligible for Refundable Security Deposit of Rs.5, 000/-.

The permitting withdrawal/ cancellation of admission upto last date of closing of admission that happened to be on 31st August or last working day of the month August each year in the situation when the Academic session commencing from 1st of August has lead to tendency among the candidates to hold their admission in the University along with other institutions where they aspire for better branch or places convening to them, but, in practice it is really farming the intent of other deserving candidates who aspire for admission in the UG

program of the University but fail to get a seat due to holding of their seat by some of the candidate till last day of admission or even after.

Considering the above demerit in permitting the candidate to withdraw their admission for a long time the Hon'ble High court of Delhi has observed in the above case (Referred in Para 1) the period of withdraw/ cancellation of admission be reduced to one week. To compile with the direction of the Hon'ble high court and decrease the candidates to with hold admissions for a long time, the following proposed:

1. The candidates who will take admission in July 2013 and withdraw/get cancelled their admission on or before 31.07.2013 shall be eligible for refund of whole fee by depositing Rs. 1000/- as processing fee.
2. The candidates who will take admission in the month of 1st to 3rd weeks August shall be eligible for full refund of fee by depositing Rs. 1000/- as processing fee, if they withdraw/cancelled their admission within a week (inclusive of Holiday if any) from the date of admission
3. The candidates who will take admission in the last week of the month of August on or date of closing of admission and get their admission cancelled after i.e 31.08.2013 shall be eligible for refundable security deposit of Rs. 5000/- only.

The above norms for withdraw/cancellation of admission shall not apply to the candidates admitted under MBA Program.

The Cancellation/withdrawal of admission and Refund Rules for MBA Program shall be as follows:

1. The candidates who will take admission in April, 2013 and withdraw/get cancelled their admission on or before 30.06.2013 shall be eligible for refund of whole fee by depositing Rs. 1000/- as processing fee.
2. The candidates who will take admission in the month of July, 2013 and, if they withdraw/cancelled their admission within a week (inclusive of Holiday if any) from the date of admission shall be eligible for refund of whole fee by depositing Rs.1,000/- as processing fee.
3. The candidates who will take admission on 30.08.2013 shall be eligible for refundable security deposit of Rs. 5000/- only.

For Refund of Security Deposit, the student should apply to the "Registrar, Delhi Technological University" enclosing therewith original Fee Receipt, Admission Slip failing which no refund will be admissible.

Decision: The Academic Council approved the proposal.

Agenda 5.12 : Enhancement of Ph.D.(Full Time) Scholarships from 50 to 100

The Academic council was informed that the University has been presently offering 50 full time Ph'D Scholarships which were approved during erstwhile DCE in addition to part time and sponsored candidates. The Candidates admitted under full time program are eligible for monthly scholarship and contingency as follows:

The expenditure on account of scholarship and contingency are currently being met from the Grant-in-Aid of the University provided by the Govt. of Delhi.

Considering the huge response from the candidates for pursuing PhD Program, the University intends to enhance the number of full time scholarship from 50 to 100 from the session 2013-14. The increases in the scholarship will double the expenditure on this account from 13.50 lacs per annum approximately to 27 lacs per annum. A part of this expenditure is proposed to be met from the Scholarship / fund received from AICTE whereas the rest shall be met from the granting of the University.

Decision : The Academic council approved the proposal.

Agenda 5.13 : Policy for filling up vacant seats in 3rd Semester of the B.Tech. Programs

The members of the Academic Council were informed that a SLP is filed in the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the matter of Ms. Astha Jain, a student of B.Tech.(Polymer Science and Chemical Technology) admitted in academic year 2011-12 regarding up-gradation against the vacant seats in the 3rd Semester The Hon'ble Delhi High Court vide its decision dated 24.8.2012 has directed the University to frame a policy with regard to providing up-gradation to meritorious students of the University in the 3rd semester of the B.Tech. program from the academic year 2013-14.

In the light of the above direction and also to provide an opportunity to the students of the University to up grade their branches, it is proposed to fill up the vacant seats in 3rd semester of B.Tech. program by up-gradation on the basis of rank/merit secured in AIEEE/JEE(Main) at the time of admission to B.Tech. program of the University from the session 2013-14 and the remaining vacant seats through lateral entry.

The academic council after deliberation decided to constitute a three members committee to suggest norms / guidelines for up-gradation of branch and filling up of the vacant seats in 3rd semester.

Decision: The Academic Council constituted a committee with terms of reference as under :

1. Prof. M.P. Gupta, Professor IIT Delhi and Hon'ble Member Academic Council.
2. Prof. B.D. Pathak, Dean, Academic, DTU.
3. Prof. H.C. Taneja, Dean, Students Welfare, DTU.

The terms of reference of the committee shall be as follows:

- a) Mechanism for up-gradation of the branches in the 3rd semester.
- b) Mechanism for filling up vacant seats in 3rd semester.

The committee will submit its recommendations within one month to the university.

Agenda 5.14: Amendment in Recruitment Regulations for Teaching positions (Professor, Associate Professor and Assistant Professor)

The Academic Council was informed that the present recruitment regulation for teaching positions (Professor, Associate Professor and Assistant Professor) were

notified by the University after getting the same approved by the Board of Management vide Order No15648-52 dated 01.12.2011.

The Delhi Technological University being a technical University largely follows the norms and guidelines framed by the AICTE for maintaining the standard of Technical Education. Therefore, in the case of faculty positions and Academic staff in Engineering streams, it should follow the Education Qualification and Experience as prescribed by the AICTE. However, being an University and awaiting recognition under section 12 (B) of the UGC act, which is likely to be received soon, in case of Faculty positions in Humanities and Sciences for which AICTE has not prescribed the same, it should follow the one prescribed by the UGC. Keeping this aspect into consideration it was felt necessary to revisit the recruitment regulation of the Faculty positions in force. While revisiting the existing RRs and proposing changes, the recruitment regulations followed in other Higher Technical Institution, such as IITs, have also been taken into consideration.

As per the provision under clause 10, 2 (b) of the first statute the Board of Management has the power to prescribed qualification and other conditions of eligibility for teachers and other academic staff after taking into account the recommendations of the Academic Council.

The amended draft recruitment regulations for the faculty positions were tabled in the meeting of Academic Council for kind perusal of the Hon'ble members. A presentation was made by the Hon'ble Chairman showing the comparison in respect of qualification and experience prescribed by the AICTE, UGC, IIT Delhi and Recruitment Rules for faculty position approved by Govt. of Delhi. The Council having gone through the proposed Recruitment Regulations for the faculty positions and the presentation unanimously approved the RRs with minor modifications.

Decision: The Academic Council approved the amended Recruitment Regulations for the faculty positions as per Annexure III.

Agenda 5.15 : Nomination of Subject Experts for forming a new panel of Subject Experts for the grant of CAS and Direct Recruitment of faculty positions

The Council that the university proposes to form a new panel of Subject Experts for the grant of CAS and Direct Recruitment of faculty positions. The current panel was prepared on the recommendation of the Academic Council vide its decision in the First meeting of the Council held on 8.1.2010.

As per the provision of Sub Clause 3 of Clause 11 of first Statutes of DTU, the Academic Council shall draw a list of experts/professionals to be members of the Selection committees constituted under Clause 16(2) and 16(3). As per the provision of sub section 2(iii) of section 16, three experts not connected with the University to be nominated by the Vice Chancellor from a panel of not less than seven names approved by the Academic Council for each department/school.

As the last panel was prepared approximately three years ago, it is felt that a fresh panel of subject experts from each discipline be prepared. Accordingly, the Heads of the concerned departments were requested to provide the name of the subject experts in respective discipline. The List of experts prepared by the university will be tabled in the meeting.

Decision: The Academic Council approved the names of the Subject Experts for the panel of 07 experts for various disciplines. The list of the experts will be submitted to the Government for approval of the Chancellor as per the provision of Statutes Clause 11(3).

Agenda 5.16 (a): Modification in the pattern of specialization offered in the Course Curriculum for MBA (2 Years Full Time Program) Delhi School of Management (To be proscribed in the Ordinance No. 3 for MBA Program)

The members of the Academic Council were informed that a proposal has been received from the Delhi School of Management to modify the pattern of the number of papers being offered in the III and IV semester of 2 years full time MBA program. The proposed changes were approved by the Board of Studies DSM in its meeting held on 28.08.2012. It has been stated that, the students are presently offered two specializations one from the technical group and other from the functional areas group. They are selecting 4 papers from either of the technical specialization in III semester and 4 papers from either of the functional areas specialization in IV semester. Offering 4 papers of the specialization only for six months and another for other six months sometimes obstructs the overall learning of the subjects. It is also pertinent to mention here that majority of institutions are offering specialization papers splitted into 2 semesters with few paper of each to be completed in each semester.

Therefore, it is proposed to change the pattern and allow the students to select 2 papers from the technical specialization and 2 papers from the non-technical specialization in each of III and IV semesters.

Accordingly, the Course Curriculum for MBA with modification in the pattern in specialization for semester III & IV Delhi School of Management shall be as follows:

Decision: Academic Council approved the proposal of DSM.

Agenda 5.16 (b) : Proposal for Amendment in Regulation 6.2 (R 6.2) of Ordinance 4 relating to PhD Degree

As per the provision of R.6.2 of Ordinance No. 4 governing the PhD Programs at DTU, the students are categorized in two categories for the purpose of course work requirements, the time period specified for completing course work, comprehensive exam, Research plan, thesis submission etc.

Group 1: A student having MSC/ MBA with a Bachelor degree of 2/3 years have to study a course work of 4 courses of 3 credits each.

Group 2: Students having M.Tech/ MBA with a Bachelor degree of 4 years have to study a course work of 2 courses of 3 credits each

With the above regulations for the coursework for Ph.D., in Delhi School of Management, students who have already studied MBA have to complete 4 courses with 3 credits whereas the students with M. Tech degree (not studied management subjects earlier) and now doing PhD in Management are required to complete 2 courses of 3 credits only. This anomaly has been discussed in the Departmental Research committee meeting held on 31.07.12. The Board of Studies of DSM in its meeting held on 28.08.12 has approved that R 6.2 of ordinance 4 relating to PhD degree be amended for those taking admission in Management Discipline and the following provisions be added in regulation 6.2 for management courses.

“A student having MBA or equivalent post graduate degree shall be required to complete 2 courses of 3 credits each, while the student with M Tech/ Msc. Degree or equivalent (Non MBA) shall be required to complete 4 courses of 3 credits each as course work.”

Accordingly, time frame has also been suggested to be modified as under:

Full Time and Part Time students must complete the comprehensive examination within

- 12 and 18 months for students with MBA degree
- 18 and 24 months for students without MBA degree

respectively from the date of joining the programme, failing which their registration will be cancelled.

Decision : Academic Council deferred the matter with the advice that the proposal be resubmitted to the council after proper analysis.

Agenda 5.16 (c): Proposal for introducing a Weekend MBA program at DSM for working Executive.

The Academic Council was informed that the Delhi School of Management has proposed to start a weekend MBA program for working Executive from the academic session 2013-14. The program will cater to the needs of working executives who intend to learn cutting edge professional and managerial skills by pursuing such programs while continuing in their existing job. It will also provide an opportunity to DSM to expand its reach by targeting young executives from public and corporate sectors for this program.

Such a program is being offered successfully by leading institutions like Indian Institute of Management, Lucknow, Indian Institute of Management Kolkata, School of Management, Guru Gobind Singh Inderprastha University at their Dwarka campus, Indian Institute of Technology, Delhi and Indian Institute of Foreign Trade, Qutub Institutional area, Delhi. Considering the strong brand equity of Delhi Technological University and proven track record of delivering quality management education by Delhi School of Management, the program is expected to attract young executives from prominent Small Scale Industries located in nearby area in Delhi and NCR, and also attract young people running their family businesses.

Objectives of the Program

The program will be offered with the following broad objectives:

- To impart theoretical knowledge in the basic functional areas of management
- To develop analytical skills of the students by exposing them to real life business problems and case studies.
- To inculcate values and attitudes which contribute to high standards of corporate social responsibility and governance.

Pedagogy

Pedagogy would be a combination of lectures, case discussions, presentations, assignments and project work. The primary emphasis would be on interactive and participative methods of learning. Faculty for the program shall be primarily in house from DSM but may also include visiting faculty. Guest lecturers from industry practitioners will also be organized to expose students to the current business environment.

Potential candidates

The program will be open to working executives/entrepreneurs drawn from the following sectors:

- Private sector
- Public sector undertakings
- Government Departments
- Entrepreneurs/Owners of Small and Medium size Enterprises
- Ex-Defence personnel who wants to pursue a career in management

Eligibility Conditions

(1) Educational Qualification

Bachelor's degree in any branch of Engineering / Technology / Architecture / Pharmacy with minimum four years duration after passing Senior Secondary Examination

OR

Bachelor's degree in Arts / Commerce / Science, CA, ICWA, CS, LLB.

All the candidates should have minimum 50% marks in aggregate (Cumulative for all the years / Semesters) or equivalent CGPA of above mentioned Degree programs. The Bachelor's Degree is a must from Indian or foreign university, recognized by AIU/UGC.

(2) Experience

The candidates with 4 years degree course must have a minimum of one years working experience at supervisory level whereas the candidates with 3 years degree course shall have a minimum of two years working experience at supervisory level as on 01st of August of the admission year.

Program Duration

The program will be two years duration spread over in four semesters. The maximum period permissible for completion of the degree will be 5 years.

Program Fee and Honorarium to Faculty and Staff

The Fee structure and payment of honorarium to the faculty and staff engaged in the programs shall be the same as approved for M.Tech Program offered by the University for the Employees of M/S Samsung India Ltd. (A copy of Order for Honorarium and Program fees in respect of M.Tech Program for the employee of M/S Samsung India Ltd.

Selection Process

The selection of the candidates to the programs shall be made through one or more of the following: Written Test/GD/PI. based on the number of Application receive for the program.

Program annual intake and Schedule of Classes

The annual intake of the Program shall be 30 and the timing of the classes is shall be normally from 10 am to 5.00 pm on Saturdays and Sundays.

The Course curriculum and scheme of the examination for the above program shall be prepared by the department and submitted for approval of the Academic Council after being approved by the Board of Studies of the department and standing review committee in its next meeting.

The academic council after deliberation took the following decision:

Decision:

1. The programme will be named as Executive MBA programme
2. Two seats, over and above the intake of the programme, shall be for the faculty and the staff of the University with exemption from payment of Tuition Fee.
3. The programme will start from the academic year 2013-14.

Agenda 5.16 (d): Approval for Diploma/ Certificate course in Management” for Engineering Students, A “Value add” for engineering students to hone their Management Quotient.

The Academic Council was informed that Delhi School of Management (DSM) started Diploma/ Certificate in Management for Engineering Students with the prime aim of developing and inculcating Management acumen in them while pursuing their Bachelor's degrees in Engineering. This will improve their performance and will put them to steep career elevation path.

The programme has been designed keeping in mind the approach of Top Notch Companies in their “prospective employee seeking” drive, and producing the blends of engineers and Managers from a University which has always strived hard to create synergy between Science and Management.

The Program was started in March, 2012 with the approval of the Chairman Academic Council after a meeting of the Heads and Deans of the University. The first Batch, admitted in March, 2012, has completed the course (Certificates yet to be issued). In this Batch 44 students have completed the requirements for award of the certificates. The list of First Batch of the Students is placed as per **Annexure IV**. The second Batch which started in the month of September, 2012 shall appear in the examination in January, 2013.

The Board of Studies of DSM has approved the program and recommended that the program should be opened to the students of other Engineering institutes of Delhi/NCR also.

Program structure:

- The program is open to B.E/B.Tech (Full Time/ Part Time), ME/M.Tech (Full Time/ Part Time) students, Research Scholars ,Faculty members and staff of DTU.
- Pedagogy includes lectures case studies, role play, simulated exercises etc.
- Diploma in Management program will have five subjects (three core and two electives) and a Project.
- Students not completing the requirements of Diploma in Management shall be awarded with Certificate in Management mentioning the subjects undertaken by them.
- To begin with Certificate Course shall be started with seven subjects out of which three will be core.
- Batch size per subject. Maximum 40 students, Minimum 10 students
- Duration of teaching semester wise. 30 hrs with Term Project

Eligibility Condition

- (i) The UG students shall be eligible for admission to the course after II Semester and the PG students shall be eligible after completion of I Semester.
- (ii) Ex students are not eligible.

Schedule of Classes

- Classes will be held at DSM, DTU from 5 pm to 7 pm on all working days and Saturdays/ Sundays, if required.

Scheme of the Examination:

Total	:	100 Marks

The conduct of examination, declaration of result and issue of Diploma / Certificate will be carried out by the Head (DSM). All the records related to the course will be maintained at DSM.

 - To make students learn the act of communicating and lasting impression.

 - To familiarize students with customer value propositions, consumer behaviour and appropriate strategies to enhance and foster customer delight.
5. International Business environment:
 - To make students gain an insight into the cross cultural and global issues, their challenges and perspectives.
6. Project management
 - To facilitate the students to understand and implement the most important part of a project or assignment.
7. Technology and Innovation Management
 - To make students familiarize with the various facets of innovation management and technological dimension.

In case number of candidates in a subject is less than 10 the subject will not be offered and the application of Fee of the candidates will be returned.

The department has requested that approval of Academic Council be obtained for the following.

- (i) Approval of the Course
- (ii) Extension of the Course to the Engineering Students of other institutions located in Delhi/ Gurgaon/Faridabad/Noida/Ghaziabad/ Sonipat and Bahadurgarh.
- (iii) Awarding of Certificates to 44 passed out candidates of First Batch admitted in March, 2012.

Decision: The Academic Council approved the programme only for the students of DTU.

Agenda 5.17 (a): Paper for Ph. D course work for the students of all branches entitled – “Engineering, Technology and Social Responsibility”

The Council was informed that a proposal has been received from the Head, Humanities Department with regard to Paper for Ph. D course work for the students of all branches entitled – “Engineering, Technology and Social Responsibility”. The Board of Studies of Humanities Department has approved the paper in its meeting held on 18.10.2011.

Decision: The Academic Council approved the proposal.

Agenda 5.17 (b): Elective Paper for all the Branches of B.Tech. entitled ‘Econometrics and Mathematical Economics’

The council was informed that ‘Econometrics and Mathematical Economics’ should be made as Elective Paper for all the Branches of B.Tech. programs. The Board of Studies of Humanities Department has approved the same along with syllabus of the course in its meeting held on 11.03.2010.

Decision : The Academic Council approved ‘Econometrics and Mathematical Economics’ as an open elective paper provided it is incorporated the course scheme of the Departments.

Agenda 5.18 : Waiver of fee to the 7 teachers of Harare Institute Technology, Harare, Zimbabwe who are pursuing M. Tech program in DTU from the Academic session 2012-13 under MoU with H.I.T and making it at par with Indian students.

The Academic Council was informed that the University has given admission to 7 teachers of HIT, Zimbabwe under MoU signed with them for pursuing M.Tech. program in DTU. The candidates were required a demand draft of US \$ 7000 in favour of the Registrar, DTU payable at Delhi as annual admission fees to the University.

The HIT, has however, themselves deposited US\$ 7000 in total for all the 7 candidates instead of depositing US\$ 7000 for each candidate totalling a fee of US\$ 49000. In the letter dated 30th August, 2012, the Vice Chancellor, HIT, has cited the MoU between both the Institutions and mentioned that it is an initiative under Indo-Zim technology transfer all for good of humanity and now vide his letter dated 5.11.2012 requested to resolve the issue of tuition fee.

The amount of fee paid by HIT, Zimbabwe for their 7 teachers is even less than the fee paid by an Indian student for a year i.e. Rs. 65000/- per annum. Thus, there is a huge difference between the amount of fee paid by HIT to the DTU in comparison to the amount required to be paid by them for continuing the studies of their 7 teachers.

Considering the request of Vice Chancellor HIT, and the fact that teachers of HIT have come to pursue M.Tech Program under Indo-Zim technology transfer all for good of humanity, It is proposed that HIT staff be given waiver of fee and charged **annual fee equivalent to Indian students pursuing M.Tech. Program in DTU.**

Decision: The Academic Council approved the proposal.

Agenda 5.19 : Introduction of B. Tech (Part time) Program in Software Technology

It was submitted for the information of Academic Council that a proposal has been received from the Department of Computer Engineering to start a B.Tech Part time Program in

Software Engineering in DTU for the employees of M/S Samsung India Ltd on self financing basis similar to M.Tech Program offered by the University for the Employee of M/s Samsung India Ltd. The Board of Studies of the Department has approved the proposal . The program objective, size and timing of the class, venue, course curriculum, duration of the course and eligibility condition have been proposed as follows:

Program Objective

- (i) This initiative would be a step further in this Industry-Academia partnership that would benefit both the parties through Knowledge sharing on latest Industrial practices, advanced technical thinking, and new research trends.
- (ii) This would help our organization to upgrade the conceptual knowledge of our existing employees.
- (iii) This would also help the SEIL to provide the employees with opportunities for Higher Education.

Size and timing of the class, venue & duration of the course

- No. of Batches per year : 1
- Class Size : Max. 30 Students per year
- Class Schedule : Two hours Monday-Friday and Saturday Eight Hours
- Venue of the Class : Samsung Office premises/DTU
- Curriculum/Duration of the Course : Four Years

Eligibility Condition:

The candidates shall be required to possess one of the following diploma/degree.

- (i) Diploma in CS/IT/Electronics after 10th
- (ii) Diploma in CS/IT/Electronics after 12th
- (iii) Bachelors in Computer Application with Physics and Mathematics at 12th
- (iv) Bachelors of Science (Maths/Computer Science/Information Technology) with Physics and Mathematics at 12th

Selection procedure

Admission to this Program shall be made on basis of Merit / Rank and entrance test conducted by the University.

Decision: The Academic Council approved the proposal with the stipulation that the Computer Engineering will run this Programme by involving faculty from the Department of Information Technology and Department of Electronics and Communication Engineering.

Agenda 5.20: Any other item with permission of chair.

The following items were also taken up for consideration of the Academic Council and decisions were taken:

A. Proposal for making changes in the scheme of examination and syllabus for the revised B.Tech (EEE) and B.Tech (EE) programmes.

B. Introduction of two new M.Tech (Evening) programmes.

The proposals of the Department of Electrical Engineering were taken up for discussion by the Academic Council. Prof. Narender Kumar, Head, Department of Electrical Engineering informed the members regarding the need for making changes in the scheme of examination and syllabus for the

revised B.Tech (EEE) and B.Tech (EE) programmes and also about two new M.Tech. Programmes the Department intends to introduce in the evening. The Academic Council, after detailed deliberation decided to constitute a five members committee to examine both the proposals of the Department of Electrical Engineering and make recommendations within specified period keeping into consideration that even semester is due to start in January 2013

Decision: Academic Council constituted the committee as follows:

The Proposal of the Head, Department of Bio-Technology for introduction of two M. Tech. Programs, as above, was considered by the Academic Council. Prof. S. Maji, HoD explained the relevance of the programmes in today's scenario and its usefulness to the students. He further apprised that both the M.Tech. Programmes and their course curriculum along with scheme of examinations are approved by the Board of studies of the Department. Academic Council, accordingly, approved the proposal.

Decision: Academic Council approved the proposal for introduction of two PG Programmes, M.Tech. in Bio-Medical Engineering and M.Tech. in Industrial Bio-Technology.


D. Introduction of M.Tech. in Hydraulics and Water Resources Engineering in place of M.Tech. in Hydraulics and Flood Controlling.

The proposal of the Department of Civil Engineering was taken up for discussion by the Academic Council. Prof. A.K. Gupta, HoD, Department of Civil Engineering informed the members that department has been running a M.Tech. Programme in Hydraulics and Flood Control for a long time, this programme has not been very popular among the students. During the last two years two - three students have taken admission in this programme. In view of this, the Department has decided to change the nomenclature of the exiting program and restructured as **M.Tech. in Hydraulics and Water Resources Engineering** in place of M.Tech. in Hydraulics and Flood Controlling. The Syllabus and scheme of examination for the new programme has been also prepared Academic Council after deliberation approved the proposal of the department.

Decision : The Academic Council Approved the proposal.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to Chair.





Policy/2012/3386-91 dated 17.07.2012, a meeting of the committee constituted for framing the policy related to Fee Concession, Financial Assistance & Concession in Hostel Fee for the students of DTU has been held on 06.08.2012 at 03.00 p.m. in the room No. 307, Main Admn. Building, DTU. In the said meeting following members were present.

1. Prof. H.C. Taneja, Dean (Student Welfare) and Chairman of the Committee.
2. Prof. N.K. Jain, Dean (CE) and Member of the Committee.
3. Prof. Daya Gupta, HoD(COE) and Member of the Committee.
4. Dr. Ravinder Kaushik, Assistant Registrar (Academic) and Member Secretary.

Prof. M.P. Gupta and Dr.K. Singh could not attend the meeting due to their preoccupation.


The Chairman welcomed all the members present in the meeting and apprised them about the agenda of the meeting.

After detailed deliberations and discussions, the recommendations of the committee regarding Fee Concession, Financial Assistance & Concession in Hostel Fee for the students of DTU under Economically Weaker Section Scheme are as under:


1. ✓ The Student whose family income from all sources is less than Rs. 4, 50,000/- per annum will only be eligible for fee concession. The Income Certificate must be issued from the parents Employer/Affidavit duly attested by 1st Class Magistrate/SDM, in case of there is no Employer.
2. The student has to submit the University Fee Receipt of the session for which fee concession claimed
3. The student has to submit the copies of the all mark sheets starting from 10th class onward.
4. The student should not have any pending back paper/re-appear/supplementary in any of the subject. In case any student have any pending back paper/re-appear/supplementary in any of the subject he/she will not be eligible for Fee Concession.
6. The student has to submit an undertaking duly counter signed by his/her parents on stamp paper of Rs.10/- duly attested by public Notary that "he/she has not obtained or applied for any grant/financial help for the same purpose from any other Ministry/Govt. Department of India/ State, any Public/Private Organization". The application of the candidate concealing the facts will automatically stand cancelled.

7. The student should not be involved in any disciplinary activity (ies) in the University.
8. The full fee concession may be given to the student's maximum upto five (05) % of the sanctioned intake for the particular year in the respective programme or equivalent to the number of double, the half fee concession may be granted to the deserving students.
9. The full fee concession may be granted to the wards (up to two children only) of all the 'Group C' employees and half fee concession may be granted to the wards (up to two children only) of all the 'Group B' employees of the DTU/ DCE over and above the student's maximum upto five (05) % of the sanctioned intake for the particular year.
10. Notwithstanding anything stated in these guidelines, for any unforeseen issues arising and not covered by these guidelines, or in event of differences of interpretation, the Vice-Chancellor may take a decision. The decision of the Vice-Chancellor shall be final.
11. The same guidelines as mentioned above may be followed for Hostel Fee Concession.




